Discussion Questions

- In 7-10 words, take a moment to write out your go to statement of wisdom when it comes to making BIG Decisions in life.
- Think about those 7-10 words for a moment, what experiences, people, and stories have shaped your decision to use those words and have handed you those words of wisdom?
- When big decisions feel more like a gamble than a sure reality, what is the one thing that helps you make a decision in the face of uncertainty?
- Before the problem is every named in Joshua 18, Joshua gathers the people at the place of peace. Where do you need to find peace in your life so that you can address the big decisions that lie in front of you?
- Joshua has a decision to make but his decision is not his alone. He involves all the people. Who are the people that you need to do a better job of involving in the decisions that you face? What do you need to do to make sure they are involved in the decision-making process of your life?
- Have you ever been crippled by data-overload when it comes to decision-making? If so, how did you get out of that space? If you have been able to avoid data-overload that limits your decision-making capacity?
- Think of big decision that you are currently facing or have faced, name out loud what you discern is/was the best decision to make. Don't consider the data or the details. Practice using intuition and name that decision before the group.
- Every decision is a decision grounded in faith over certainty. In your life, where do you think your faith has most often been grounded. How can you shift that faith towards God? And what might happen if you do?
